

SHORT BIOGRAPHY AND KEY REFERENCES

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Nicholas Low is the Director of the Australasian Centre for Governance and Management of Urban Transport (GAMUT) at the Uni. of Melbourne, Australia. He is the author or editor of eight books, two of which have won national and international prizes. He is known for his contributions to the study of the politics of planning and transport, and for his international research on urban sustainability published in numerous international journal articles, book chapters, and monographs. He convened the 1997 conference at the Uni. of Melbourne on Environmental Justice and the 2010 international conference on Sustainable Transport in the Asia-Indo-Pacific: Varied Contexts - Common Aims. His book (with Brendan Gleeson) "Justice, Society and Nature" won the Harold and Margaret Sprout Prize of the International Studies Association 1998 for the best book published on ecological politics in that year. He has received numerous research grants and sponsored research projects from Australian as well as international research sources. He is on the editorial boards of several major international journals on urban policy, planning, and environmental sciences.
